

AIRFIELD MANAGEMENT

As an Airfield Management Specialist, you are one of the primary responders to in-flight and ground emergencies, and you'll be responsible for the removal or dispersal of birds and wildlife on or near the airfield using pyrotechnics or bioacoustics to scare the threat off the airfield environment. The Airfield Management Specialist is also responsible for issuing Notices to Airmen for flight hazards or restrictions at your airfield or in your airspace that would pose safety problems to pilots flying to your airfield or through the airspace.

MAJOR TASKS

- Inspect airfields and ensure a safe operating environment for personnel and aircraft operation
- Coordinate with agencies including air traffic control, civil engineers, and command post
- Perform mobile airfield management for worldwide deployment of aircraft
- Provide aircrews with information and services related to airfield management and flight planning

REQUIREMENTS

- Knowledge of navigational aids and airfield regulations normal color vision
- Ability to speak distinctly in person and over air-to-ground radios
- Possession of a valid state driver's license to operate government motor vehicles
- Completion of a current National Agency Check, Local Agency Checks and Credit
- Completion of 7.5 weeks of Basic Military Training as well as Airmen's Week
- Must be between the ages of 17 and 39
- High School diploma or GED
